CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION TRACK

As an educator, you can change lives every day. A Master of Education (M.Ed.) degree has the potential to change your life.

The Master of Educational Leadership program prepares educators with skills that provide the background to lead in a broad range of educational settings.

Educational leadership involves working with diverse educational communities to meet common educational goals. All coursework in this program is focused on building educational leaders who explore multiple facets of the learning environment, coaching and leadership models, evaluation techniques, and instructional design methods.

Combine online learning with part or full-time study, and four academic terms per year, to create a flexible and personalized schedule.



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EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP

This program prepares educators with skills that provide the background to lead in a broad range of educational settings, looking forward to the needs of the future. Through a common core, elective courses and fully implemented action research projects, leaders can design an educational plan that meets individualized professional goals. After completing core courses, students will select from an array of electives to build expertise in a content area which supports the individualized action research project.

Each Master's degree is comprised of 36 credits. The general M.Ed. in Educational Leadership has six required courses and six electives. Areas of specialization, such as Curriculum and Instruction may have more required courses.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

Bachelor's degree from a regionally- accredited college or university generally with a GPA of 2.8 or greater on a 4.0 scale; Current access to an educational setting in which you can conduct action research;

Assessment of a completed Admissions Portfolio.
