Franklin Pierce University College of Health and Natural Sciences admissions@franklinpierce.edu Franklin Pierce University's Master's Entry Program in Nursing (MEPN) provides students with a solid foundation in nursing and masters level courses so they can learn the necessary skills to deliver high-quality and patient-centered care in a variety of settings. At the end of the program, students will be prepared to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN exam). In addition, students will earn a master's degree in nursing and a Certificate in Healthcare Administration.

The MEPN program is located at the Manchester, N.H. Academic Center, and is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing. It is also approved by the New Hampshire Board of Nursing. Upon completion of your bachelors degree, this accelerated program occurs over six consecutive 12-week terms totaling 18 months. A new cohort begins in the fall each year.

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REQUIREMENTS:

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Requirements for high school applicants seeking admission to the MEPN Direct Entry Program include:

- A minimum cumulative grade point average in academic courses of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Completion of two years of math (minimum of algebra) with grade B or above
- Completion of three years of science with grade B or above one of which should be chemistry
- Demonstrated leadership through community and school activities.

Once admitted to Franklin Pierce University, to successfully progress from undergraduate studies to the MEPN program by Direct Entry, students must meet the **Progression Qualifications for Undergraduate Students.**

If an admitted student fails to meet progression standards, they will be encouraged to reapply for entry during their senior year. Admitted students will be assigned a nursing faculty advisor in addition to their undergraduate advisor. The nursing faculty advisor will be available for questions pertaining to the MEPN program.

Progression Qualifications for Undergraduate Students:

- Minimum grade of B in each of the following courses:
 - Anatomy & Physiology I (lab required)
 - Anatomy & Physiology II (lab required)
 - Chemistry (lab required)
 - Statistics
 - Human Growth & Development
 - Microbiology (lab required)
- Graduate with a bachelor's degree with CGPA 3.0 on 4.0 scale
